- **Postdoctoral Researcher**

We have a fully funded postdoctoral position for 3 years to work on a large scale research program on early biomarkers for development and monitoring of effective disease-modifying therapies led by Dr. Mallar Chakravarty and Dr. Marco Prado (<https://itn.neuroimpact.ca/>).

The postdoctoral researcher will work in collaboration with Dr. Justine Cléry and Dr. Christine Tardif in the marmoset neuroimaging part of this program. Their mission will be to help set up the platform to perform functional imaging in awake marmosets at McGill and perform behavioral assessment and measures.

Applicants should have a PhD in neuroscience or other relevant fields. We are especially interested in candidates with skills in the analysis of neuroimaging data, behavioral data and/or animal models. Prior work with nonhuman primates is a plus but not a requirement.
